Because a national anthem is a patriotic musical composition that eulogizes the history, traditions, and struggles of its people. For example, the words of this country's anthem says it clearly: *Our flag, reddened with the blood of victory, bears the spirit of the country.* 

The majority of national anthems are marches or hymns in style. Countries of Latin America, Central Asia, and Europe favor ornate and operatic pieces, while those in the Middle East, Oceania, Africa, and the Caribbean use a more simplistic fanfare.

### OUTWARD BOUND VIETNAM



An Outward Bound Vietnam trip to their facilities in Quy Nhon is planned from September 9<sup>th</sup> to 14th for Years 6 & 7.

Outward Bound Vietnam operates wilderness programmes using expeditionary learning. Expeditionary learning sees participants engage in a 'learning expedition', which is a journey that utilizes a single means of transportation as the primary vehicle for movement. We must make it absolutely clear: Outward Bound is not an 'activity centre'. As such, each participant engages in endeavours that enhance empathy, success and failure, collaboration and competition, and diversity and inclusion. All these endeavours are grounded in the dramatic environment of the natural world. This course includes tasks such as route planning, menu planning, navigation and exploration, and skills development. It takes place while trekking, and it extends to other areas such as reflective learning and facilitated processes, involving in-depth opportunities for leadership, self-reflection, interpersonal feedback, confidence and decision-making.
