Principal's Message: The Power of Communication

Dear Parents,

When students learn English at Singapore International School, they learn more than words. They learn to communicate. Sometimes we need to listen to the message of our youth. You may have seen the news and social media about the virtues of expressing opinions about the environment. Most recently, much of the world has directed attention to the young Swedish climate activist, Greta Thunberg. Her message has brought inspiration and criticism. She knows how to communicate.

Greta jumped into the media spotlight. To millions of people young and old, the 16-year old is a motivator of environmental awareness. To the few and politically/corporate-biased, the Swede is regularly their focus of abuse. She is an adolescent with the ability to generate uninhibited warnings that creates reactions. Why? Each month, we will introduce a teacher and briefly provide some interesting facts about this person.

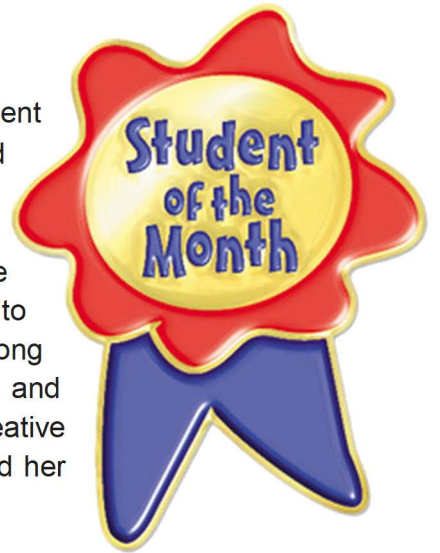
Nguyen Thi Linh – Nursery School Teacher
